Here is how you can participate:

- Drop-off your saved seeds to share, make sure these are open-pollinated and labeled with type of seed and year collected.
- Pick up seeds. Please only take what you need, place in an envelope, label your envelope and be sure to leave some for others. Also, grow these seeds out, save some seeds, and next year share these with your neighbors.
- Post local seed and gardening info on the bulletin board to share with others.
- Take some time to sit down and draw out a Seed Story to post on the bulletin board.
- Listen to Seed Stories recorded by SeedBroadcast.
- Contact SeedBroadcast if you would like to record your own audio story.
